

Master of Science (MS) - Computer Science

Program Requirements:

A minimum of 30 credit hours of coursework in Computer Science (CMP SCI) are required for the degree program. Additional options for fulfilling credit requirements include:

- Up to 10 credit hours can be transferred into the program
- Up to 6 credit hours of related coursework can be completed outside of CMP SCI, based on the student's interest with permission of the Graduate Director
- Students with relevant prior full-time training and/or experience of a minimum of one year can apply for up to 6 proficiency transfer credit hours in CMP SCI 5991

Application Requirements:

- 1. Online Graduate Application
- 2. Applicants will be evaluated for proficiency in the following foundational areas.
 - a. <u>Computer Science</u>
 - 1. At least two different modern general-purpose programming languages.
 - 2. Object-oriented programming, concepts, and terminology
 - 3. Basic dynamic data structures such as strings, lists, stacks, queues, and trees
 - 4. Design and analysis of algorithms
 - 5. Mathematical foundation for computer science (discrete structures) with topics such as sets, logic, functions, and relations
 - b. Mathematics
 - 1. A calculus course
 - 2. A probability and statistics course

A Computer Science degree is not required for admission to the program, but applicants must demonstrate proficiency in the foundational areas. This can be prior coursework on transcripts or non-academic training/relevant experience. Applicants must detail these items in the Statement of Purpose/Intent.

• If a course on an applicant's transcript covers a foundational area but has a different title, additional documentation such as an official syllabus may be submitted.

Applicants who cannot adequately demonstrate proficiency may be admitted on a restricted status, which must be satisfied before starting the program, during the first semester, or through additional evidence of competency or assessment.

- Prerequisite courses taken to fulfill these restrictions do not count toward the program's 30 required credit hours
- 3. Statement of Purpose: A 1-2 page essay that explains your interest in the program and includes any necessary evidence regarding the foundational Areas.
- 4. Official transcripts from all universities attended. A Bachelor's degree is required.
- 5. Entrance examinations:
 - a. International Students must document English proficiency by providing scores from an internationally accepted standardized examination. See International Admissions for more information.

6. Minimum GPA of 3.0 on 4.0 scale

- a. Applicants whose overall GPA is 2.75 to 2.99 may be admitted under some circumstances by providing a Statement of Purpose/Intent that indicates additional support such as letters of reference, experience, GRE, etc.
- b. Applicants with GPA below 2.75 will only be considered if they submit a Statement of Purpose/Intent that details extensive related experience.



Application Deadlines:

Domestic Applicants: Fall - July 1 & Spring - December 1 & Summer - May 1

International Applicants: Fall – May 1 ◊ Spring - October 1

Applications submitted after the deadlines will be considered for admissions on a rolling basis until the beginning of the semester.

\$50 for domestic applicants \$40 for international applicants
